

Seibu Group's Response to the Emergency Declaration

The Seibu Group (“The Group”) has been implementing various measures to prevent the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19) infection to ensure the safety of our customers and employees, asking for their understanding and cooperation.

As the declaration of a state of emergency was issued by the Japanese government, the Group will continue to take measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 as follows.

1. The Seibu Group’s Policy Responses to COVID-19

- Each company in the Group where its head offices/business offices are located within the area subject to measures under the state of emergency will continue operations under the following policies.
 - ✓ Reduce the number of office staff by 70 percent through telecommuting.
 - ✓ Strictly limit domestic business trips to/from areas subject to measures under the state of the emergency (Business trips abroad are basically not permitted)
 - ✓ Prohibit social gatherings, etc.

2. Each company’s Response to COVID-19

1) Seibu Railway

As the declaration of a state of emergency was issued by the Japanese government, Seibu Railway will move up its last-train departure times on Seibu-Ikebukuro Line, Seibu-Yurakucho Line and Seibu-Shinjuku Line starting from Jan. 20 for the time being. The change of the last trains’ departure time doesn’t apply to the timetable which is scheduled to be revised in the spring of 2021.

2) Prince Hotels

Considering current booking demand and the declaration of a state of emergency, Prince Hotels will change operations in the following hotels and areas to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

The operation format will be reviewed depending on circumstances.
